#### **CELEBRATING ST ELIJAH & OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL**

Next Sunday, 24th June, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Nativity of St John the Baptist, who, of course, was Our Lord's cousin and whose birth is remembered every time we recite the Benedictus. In many parts of Europe, this Feast also marks midsummer and there are great celebrations for the shortest night of the year. Occasionally I visit my friends in the south German Alps where Johannestag-St John's Day- is kept with great energy: marching bands, huge bonfires high on the mountains, fireworks and lots of partying all night!


Some of you may know that it was here, in south Germany at age 12, that I first met Catholics, and decided that when I returned home to England I would become one, too! Unfortunately, I didn't know any so I had to find out as best I could what it was all about. I eventually found a Catholic Church and, there, I found a little book called the Little Way which I took away to read. It was St Therese of Lisieux's Little Way which I thought would tell me how to be a Catholic. Many years later I met a priest and told him the story. He said that I wasn't yet a Catholic- but I was a Carmelite and he received me into the Church, there and then! St Therese has been a very special friend ever since.

We all have interesting stories about our journey to Carmel and sometimes we share these in our Formation sessions. It can really help us understand what God is doing for us. If you would like to write your story we could add these to our archives.

You will probably have heard of the new legal requirements for holding data- that is, your personal information. Please pray for Maureen and come along to support her. I have also talked to Fr Francis, the Prior, about how we might help this year and, if you can help, I can give your more details when we meet on 7th July. *All good wishes*.
